

(Chapel & Multi Faith Prayer Room)

We hold regular services in the hospital chapel which is situated along the main corridor at location C4.

There is also multi faith prayer facility in the Chapel area for patients and visitors use. Prayer Mats and Holy Books are available.

(There is a separate Multi Faith Prayer Room in building 12 for staff use only)

The Chapel is open everyday for private reflection and prayer.

There is a Christian Service of Holy Communion each Sunday Morning in the Chapel at 10.00am (location C4).

There is a Roman Catholic Mass, or Eucharistic Service each Tuesday afternoon in the Chapel at 1.15pm (Location C4).

There are Sikh prayers for Sarbat Da Bhalla each Thursday afternoon at 1.00pm (location C4).

There are Muslim Friday Prayers weekly in the Multi Faith Prayer Room (in Building 12) (Please see Chapel / Prayer Room for exact time).

Patients can be escorted to the Chapel / Prayer Facility by volunteers, with ward staff permission.
